Member Spotlight Heidi Cervantes, CSI | FitzGerald Architects Associates





Event Recap Chapter Meeting - Tuesday, March 27, 2018

Future Forward -

2018 Student Scholarship Winners Announced, 2019 CSI Chicago Slate Announced plus a great Introduction to Specifying Resilience.

The March 27th membership meeting at the East Bank Club earned the theme Future Forward. It was jammed

packed with attendees (over 100) and important information about our Community's Future, our Chapter's Future and our Industry's Future.

The meeting opened with the announcement of CSI Chicago's 2018 Student Scholarship Recipients – IIT College of Architecture Students: Amjad Alkoud, Minsung Kim and Hyunhee Park. CSI Chicago is proud to support and help develop the future architects of our industry through this program. To learn more about the recipients and our scholarship sponsors visit our 2018 Student Scholarship webpage.



After recognizing our Student Scholarship Recipients, Melissa Gibson (CSI Chicago President) announced the CSI Chicago's future 2019 Board of Directors Slate and opened up nominations to the floor. The 2019 Board of Director Slate was finalized and chapter voting followed. Results of the chapter election can be found in the <u>chapter news section</u> of this newsletter.

The meeting was capped off with a presentation on Specifying Resilience by Shannon Gedey AIA, RELi AP, LEED AP BD+C of Perkins+Will. Shannon's presentation focused on what Resilience means for Chicago and what the key vulnerabilities in the Chicago area. She provided an overview of the new RELi credit rating system and credentialing process and walked everyone through Chicago case studies that demonstrated tangible resilience strategies at a

Hot Tip of the Month Efficiency and Quality are Directly Proportional

When preparing Construction Documents for full services including the earlier phases of Schematic Design and Design Development firms both want to produce quality Construction Documents and they want to produce the documents within the schedule and manpower which is profitable for the firm. The best way to assure producing quality construction documents is to work efficiently; and if you focus on working efficiently, then the quality of the construction documents will be higher. Efficiency and quality in the SD, DD and CD phases are directly proportional. There is however a price. Up front there needs to be a well-ordered plan knowing what needs to be done, when it needs to be done and to what level of quality or completeness it needs to be done and when.

For example, if the project will include a wall system that consists of a cladding element such as metal panels or brick, a cavity, an attachment system, an air/vapor membrane, sheathing, framing system, etc. Take a little time early, in SD or early in DD, and evaluate the right composition of the system including the technical data of all components and accurately develop the system including the overall dimensioning of the system. This becomes a trusted "building block" when developing details where this system interfaces with adjacent systems. Performance criteria can be established, specifications can be written, and notation can be used so that the drawings, any material matrices and the specifications can be consistent.

The Benefits of Speed Dating Events

Over the past year, several Conpsectus team members have attended architect-manufacturer summits, colloquially known as 'speed dating' events. David Stutzman recently returned from SpArc in Fort Worth, Texas, which is run by Opal Summits. Last month I attended CSi2eye, a one-day program presented by Chicago Chapter CSI. Many of us have, in previous years, attended CSI's Master Specifiers Retreat and BOND's Arc US event. With the exception of CSi2eye (which is one day and locally-hosted), these are all multi-day conferences that require attendees to travel, remain on site, and participate in a series of 20 or 30 minute meetings with product reps over the course of the event.

When they work as planned, these events are designed to be beneficial for all. The organizer makes a profit by charging manufacturers enough to pay for the entire event, including the costs for their own staff, presenters, and covering the costs for architects and specifiers to attend. The manufacturers' representatives receive significant one-on-one time with lead designers and technical architects, permitting them to get the word out about their products and to present themselves as skilled problem solvers and trusted advisors. The architects and specifiers attending the event receive continuing education, are presented a keynote speech, and also benefit from the face to face meetings with manufacturers.

For fire-rated joints, we are finding that more designers and building owners are not happy with the traditional firestop sealant solution.
